Subject:-Grant of 3rd Renewal of Permission to Aroma Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Vill. Shantershah, Post-Daulatpur, Distt-Haridwar, Uttarakhand-249402 (Inst. ID-AYU0643) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

- Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Aroma Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Vill. Shantershah, Post-Daulatpur, Distt-Haridwar, Uttarakhand-249402 (Inst. ID-AYU0643)** inspection of your College was conducted on **15.02.2024 & 16.02.2024 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **3rd renewal of permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcoming/defect have been observed:-**

1) **List of teaching departments:-**

- Computer and printer not available in Dean Office.

2) **Central Library:-**

- There is the Shortcoming of 24 seats against the minimum requirement of 50 seats.

3) **Herbal Garden:-**

- Demonstration room is not available.

4) **Teaching staffs:-**

- Availability of total teaching staff for issuance of 3rd renewal of permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course after considering the teachers is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{15}{17} \times 100\% = 88.2\%$ (Excluding Excess and visitor observation report) which is not fulfilling the criteria as per Schedule-V of MSR 2016.

5) **Functionality of the hospital:-**

a) There were zero deliveries conducted from 1st Jan 2023 to 31st Dec 2023.

(3) As per the direction, the assessment report was placed in the **90th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **17.05.2024**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no. dated 29.05.2024** to appear on **04.06.2024** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the 3rd renewal of permission to your college with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied.**

(4) The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide ref. no. **AAMC/2024/52 dated 01.06.2024** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Amita Jhunjunwala, Principal of college** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **04.06.2024** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

3) Herbal Garden:- a) Demonstration room is not available.		3. During the visitation visitor move to demonstration room & verified physically. We have 2 demonstration room one is for green herbs & other one is for dry herbs those can see in video & picture along with both visitors. These video & picture are attached.		College submitted that We have 2 demonstration rooms one is for green herbs & other one is for dry herbs, verified by visitors too. Hearing committee verified through online visit to herbal garden, found that there was 01 demonstration room having 15 students seating capacity and other was green house. Submission may be considered.			
4) Teaching staffs:-		4. At the time of part -1 filling we have already appointed to assistant professor & associate professor both as Dr. Topesh Pal & Dr. Vidhu Saxena respectively but both were not linked in part one due to some technical error shown in portal of part -1. Faculty & institute also send mail to NCISM to dissolve this technical issue on 08/02/2024 but it was not solving in appropriate time. Regarding this issue mail send to NCISM is attached. Beside of this both teachers are physically verified that can be seen in photograph of teaching staff as well as in videography in presence of both visitors. Verified copy of annexure-1. Photography with visitor 1 and 2		College submitted that we have appointed 01 assistant professor Dr. Topesh Pal & 01 associate professor Dr. Vidhu Saxena but both were not linked in part one due to some technical error shown in portal of part -1. Faculty & institute also send mail to NCISM to dissolve this technical issue on 08/02/2024 but it was not solving in appropriate time. Beside of this both teachers were physically verified by visitors that can be seen in photograph of teaching staff. Dr. Topesh Pal, Assistant Professor in Swasthvritta & yoga relieved from college on 16/05/2024 and Dr. Geeta (AYSV01066) has appointed on 03/04/2024 as Assistant Professor in Swasthvritta & yoga.

- (5) The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and once again the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **93rd Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **on 13.06.2024.**
- (6) Therefore, **3rd renewal of permission is issued to Aroma Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Vill. Shantershah, Post-Daulatpur, Distt-Haridwar, Uttarakhand-249402 (Inst. ID-AYU0643) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming shall be fulfilled along with the following requirements: -**
- I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - II. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref

no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

- (7) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- (8) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- (9) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- (10) **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:-**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 above, should be fulfilled.
- (11) The College administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are available in the 2nd professional BAMS course before the admission of 5th batch of students under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
- (12) The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time as per the norms which will be verified by the medical assessment and rating board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
- (13) The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
- (14) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
